

# **EPISODE #3021 FLOORS ARE OUR FRIENDS**

# **Bathroom Floor**

## **Linoleum Sheet Vinyl Preparation**

- · Prepare bathroom by removing the toilet and any shoe molding
  - · Be careful not to break the moulding
  - Label each piece of moulding to remind you where to put them back
- Once the surface is prepared, there are two ways to proceed before laying the floor.
  We used Option #1, but should have used Option #2!

### Option #1 (see fig. A)

- Remove old linoleum floor = THE HARD WAY
- · Smooth and level the floor's surface
  - Scrape old adhesive off the floor = nightmare!!!
  - Sand the floor
  - Patch and level the floor

#### Option #2

- Lay new floor directly over the new one = THE EASY WAY
- Clean the old floor thoroughly
- · Apply a leveling compound with a trowel

#### Laying the Floor

- Make a template of the bathroom floor out of paper
  - Place pieces of paper on the floor, and tape them together to create one giant floor pattern
  - To keep the template from slipping, cut out triangles within the paper (not on the edges) and place pieces of tape over the triangles.
  - · Cut paper around objects such as the toilet, sink, and bathtub
- Carefully lift the giant pattern and place over the laid out piece of linoleum
- Tape the paper template (through the triangles) to the linoleum floor
- Trace the pattern onto the linoleum floor and remove the paper (see fig. B)
- Carefully cut out the floor with a vinyl floor cutter
  - Remember to put something under the linoleum so the floor does not get scratched
- Roll up the linoleum floor and bring it to the bathroom, do not crease!!!
- · Lay down the new floor in the space and carefully trim the excess and messy bits
- Peel back half of the floor and apply vinyl glue (wet adhesive)
- Replace floor and smooth out any creases and air bubbles with a rolling bin or a wine bottle
- · Repeat with the other half
- Sit back, relax and let the glue dry (see fig. C)

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## **Finishing Touches**

- · Replace the moulding and the toilet
- · Re-caulk around the toilet
- Install a threshold (a metal plate in the doorway to prevent the linoleum from lifting)

# **Laundry Room Floor**

## **Vinyl Tiles**

 When purchasing vinyl tiles, make sure that every box is from the same lot (check lot numbers), as the colours can vary from lot to lot.

#### **Preparation**

- Remove everything from the room
- Prepare the floor's surface
  - · Patch and fill seams with a patching compound
    - Follow the product's instructions
    - · apply compound with a trowel
  - When the compound is a grayish white, sand smooth
  - · Clean the floor very well
    - Even one grain of sand can be felt through the vinyl tiles

#### Layout

- Plan the layout of the tiles so that you don't have a small sliver of tile at the end of the row
- Measure and mark the centre of the room with two intersecting chalk lines

#### Laying the Tiles (see fig. D)

- Apply the pre-mixed compound with a ridged trowel
- · Wait until the glue is dry to touch before laying the tiles
  - You will be able to walk on the glue when it is ready for tiling
- Line up the first tile perfectly with the intersecting chalk lines in the centre of the room
- · Lay all the whole tiles on the floor
- Measure and cut tiles for the outside edges with the TILE CUTTER (tool of the day) (see fig. E)
- Finish laying cut tiles (see fig. F)
- Roll the entire floor with a 100 pound roller, (you can rent from most rental stores) in one direction, and then again in the other direction to squish the tiles in place
